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AWARDS AVAILABLE FOR ALL SD57 GRADS

A.L. Ford Memorial Scholarship

This annual scholarship was established in 1995 by Isabel Ford as a memorial for her late husband, A.L. Ford. A.L. Ford was a communications pioneer in Prince George, serving 48 years with CN Telegraph. From the arrival of telegraph services to Prince George to the evolving telecommunications services of the 1970's, A.L. Ford worked in areas that we now call "information technology".

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$1,000

Eligibility: Open to students who intend to pursue a career in information technology.

Criteria: Demonstrate a high level of academic achievement over the last two years and have demonstrated good citizenship. Must plan to enroll in post-secondary studies leading to a career in telecommunications or other areas covered under the broad umbrella of information technology. Must plan to pursue their education in a full time program of two or more academic years in any one of the following:

- a) Technical training
- b) University studies
- c) College studies

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining good citizenship must accompany application.

Additional Documents required: Include a short letter indicating your intentions to pursue a career in Information Technology

School Specific: ALL

Aboriginal Student, Joan McKay Memorial Bursary

This award was established and funded in 2015 by Joan McKay in an effort to support aboriginal students in School District 57. Joan was a lover of nature who passed away peacefully in her sleep in 2023 a few months shy of her 90th birthday. Joan left behind many family members across Canada.

Number of Awards: 3

Amount of Each Award: \$1,000.00

Eligibility: Must be a self-identified aboriginal student.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Extra documents to include with your application: Declaration of Family Income

Additional Documents required: Declaration of Family Income

Ben Guilliamse Memorial Bursary

This award was established by the Kiwanis Club of Prince George to honour one of their members, Ben Guilliamse. This award will go to a student who has participated in Science Fairs within School District No. 57 and want to pursue a career in the Sciences.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$500

Eligibility: Open to all students in School District No. 57 who want to pursue a career in the Sciences

Criteria: Demonstrate satisfactory academic achievement and financial need

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Conditions: A letter of reference or certificate outlining active involvement in a school Science Fair.

Additional Documents required: (1) Letter indicating your previous experiences & career plans related to the sciences.
(2) Reference letter outlining your active involvement in school Science Fair
(3) Declaration of Family Income

School Specific: ALL

Bev Hosker Memorial Scholarship

This awards was established by family and friends of Bev Hosker. Born in Fort St. John, Bev was a member of the first ever female RCMP troop. She went on to serve 24 years with the RCMP throughout British Columbia. Bev was in integral member of the District Parent Advisory Councils in both Quesnel and Prince George, and a tireless advocate for the rights of students and parents. She was a particularly strong believer in the need to increase the numbers of young women pursuing studies in math and science. This award will go to someone who embodies Bev's commitment to community and school and plans to pursue further studies in a mathematics related field.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$875

Eligibility: Open to a student who identifies as female who shows an aptitude for mathematics. Applicants must intend to pursue a career in a mathematics related field (mathematics, finance, science).

Criteria: Demonstrated high level of academic achievement. Demonstrated leadership and involvement in school and community activities. Demonstrated strong aptitude in mathematics.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Conditions: A letter of reference outlining leadership and involvement in school and community activities must accompany application

Additional Documents required: (1) Short letter indicating your plans to pursue Post Secondary education relating to Mathematics, Finance or Science
(2) Reference letter

Bill & Gairett MacIver Memorial Bursary

This award was established in 2007 by family and friends to honor the memory of Gairett MacIver. Gairett will be remembered for his courage, determination, zest for life and ability to maintain an above average academic standing despite having to deal with his illness and eventual 4 organ transplant. Gairett was a student at D.P. Todd Secondary

School. He graduated in 2006 and passed away in 2007. This award is in recognition of all the support the medical professionals provided to Gairett throughout his illness.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$1,000

Eligibility: Open to students who attend school within School District No. 57 and who are intending to pursue a post-secondary education in the field of health sciences.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need. Demonstrated perseverance, strength and determination when faced with a significant challenge.

Selection Process: Selected by the District Awards Committee

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining the specifics of the student and their struggle should accompany application. Further letters may be penned by school personnel, friends, family or the student themselves.

Additional Documents required: (1) Short letter indicating the field in health sciences that you plan to pursue
(2) Reference letter outlining the specifics of the students and their struggle.

Blackburn Family Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1994 by the Blackburn family who arrived in the Pineview area in the 1920's. The Blackburn's have always taken an active role in the community where the first log school was built on their farm land. The award is intended to recognize and provide financial support to a student who attended Blackburn Elementary, Giscome Elementary, Pineview Elementary, Buckhorn Elementary or Hixon Elementary School.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$500

Eligibility: Open to students who attended one of these schools for 2 or more years: Blackburn, Giscome, Pineview, Buckhorn, or Hixon Elementary.

Criteria: Demonstrated academic excellence and a strong involvement in their school and/or community.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining school/community involvement must accompany application.

Additional Documents required: (1) Proof of enrollment at Blackburn, Giscome, Pineview, Buckhorn or Hixon Elementary for 2+ years. Proof can be report cards from 2+ years, or a Permanent Student Record that you can request from the counselling Dept at your highschool.
(2) Reference letter

School Specific: ALL

Brij M. Madhok, PGRCC Criminology Scholarship

This award was established in 1988 by the Hutda Lake Camp to provide financial assistance to a graduating student who plans to pursue post-secondary education in the field of criminology.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$1,050

Eligibility: Open to students who plan to enroll in a post-secondary educational institution in the field of criminology.

Criteria: Demonstrated high level of academic achievement. Demonstrated good character as evidenced by letters of reference.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Condition: Dependents of Corrections staff are not disqualified. Letters of reference outlining character must accompany application.

Additional Documents required: (1) short letter indicating your interest in the field of criminology
(2) Reference letter

Bryan Johnson Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the friends and family of Bryan Johnson, a Prince George businessman. He was a very warm, friendly person with a tremendous zest for life. The purpose of this scholarship is to acknowledge students who are self-motivated and who pursue excellence in their endeavors. Bryan's untimely death occurred in an avalanche while skiing on Mount Rider, February 4, 1995. He is sadly missed by his wife, family and friends.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$300

Eligibility: Open to all students.

Criteria: Demonstrated high level of academic achievement. Demonstrated leadership or involvement in extracurricular and/or community activities.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining leadership and community involvement must accompany application.

Additional Documents required: Reference letter

School Specific: ALL

Buckhorn Community Recreation Commission Scholarship

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$500

Eligibility: Open to students who have attended Buckhorn Elementary School for a minimum of two years and have shown an interest in promoting community programs.

Criteria: Demonstrated high level of academic achievement. Demonstrated community service.

Selection Process: Selected by Donor

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining community service must accompany application.

Additional Documents required: (1) Reference letter
(2) Proof of attendance at Buckhorn Elementary for 2+ years. Proof can be report cards from 2+ years, or a Permanent Student Record that you can request from the counselling Dept at your highschool.

School Specific: ALL

Caledonia Nordic Ski Club Scholarship

Sponsored by Nordics Forest Company which manages the ski club's woodlot.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$500

Eligibility: Open to students currently enrolled in any secondary school participating in the District Awards Program who is a current member in good standing of the Caledonia Nordic Ski Club and:

a) Has been an active member of a Caledonia Nordic Ski Challenge Group for at least their senior years.

Or

b) Has been an active coach or instructor with the Caledonia Nordic Ski Club for at least their senior years.

Or

c) Has been an active volunteer with the Caledonia Nordic Ski Club for at least their senior years.

Criteria: Demonstrated high level of academic achievement. Has been an active member of the Caledonia Nordic Ski Club, as an athlete, coach/instructor, and/or volunteer for at least their senior years.

Selection Process: Selected by Donor

Special Conditions: Should there be no successful candidate, two scholarships may be offered in the following year.

Candidate should describe in writing their involvement with the Caledonia Nordic Ski Club.

Additional Documents required: Include a short letter indicating your participation with the Caledonia Nordic Ski Club, including approximately when and how you participated

Cariboo Cougars Alumni Scholarship

Financial Support for a graduating student participating on one of the Cariboo Cougars hockey teams. Eligible applicants must be planning to pursue post-secondary education and/or technical training in any specific field.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Award: \$500

Eligibility: Open to grade 12 students who currently play for a Cariboo Cougars hockey team.

Criteria: The successful applicant has demonstrated a high level of academic achievement; has proven school and/or community involvement; and possesses above average leadership skills. The selected applicant will have up to four years to claim this award following high school graduation.

Selection Process: Selected by Donor

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Additional Documents required: None

Amount of Each Award: \$1,000

Eligibility: Open to students who attend schools in the City of Prince George, and who are members or sons & daughters of CUPE Local 1048 members.

Criteria: Demonstrated academic excellence. Demonstrated community involvement.

Selection Process: Selected by Donor

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining community service must accompany application.

Don Thorlakson Memorial Scholarship

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$1,000

Eligibility: Open to students who intend to pursue a career in human services including but not limited to: nursing, education, social work, speech and language pathology, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and probation officer. Preference will be given to applicants who have been in an English as a Second Language program.

Criteria: Demonstrated care and compassion by volunteering in the school or community and financial need.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining care and concern for others must accompany application. UNBC will provide matching support in the amount of a \$1,000 tuition waiver for the recipient.

Additional Documents required: (1) A short letter indicating your career in human services that you plan to pursue
(2) reference letter outlining care and concern for others

Dr. Amanada Assay Memorial Bursary

One bursary will be allocated to a student who will be attending post-secondary after graduating from SD# 57 in Prince George, BC. Preference given to female students, going on to post-secondary education, who participate in hockey, ringette, baseball or softball.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$300

Eligibility: Open to a student going on to Post-secondary education, who participate in hockey, ringette, baseball or softball. Preference to a female student. One Bursary will be distributed to each SD57 (Prince George, BC) and SD8 (Nelson, BC) each year.

Criteria: Demonstrate a high level of academic achievement.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Additional Documents required: (1) Proof of participation in hockey, ringette, baseball or softball. Can be a letter or email from the group that you are part of, receipt of payment for dues related to the sport or other related documentation

The death of a child represents the loss of potential. This award has been established to augment the potential of a grade 12 graduate from School District No. 57, who plans to enter either a General Nursing Diploma Program or Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program.

Amount of Each Award: \$1,000

Eligibility: Open to students who indicate an intention to enroll in a recognized General Nursing Diploma Program or a Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program.

Criteria:

- Demonstrate high level of academic achievement.
- Demonstrate involvement in school and/or community affairs.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining involvement in school and/or community affairs must accompany application. Recipient of this award must provide proof of registration in a recognized nursing program.

Special Conditions: A letter indicating reasons for pursuing a nursing career must accompany the application. A letter of reference outlining good character and involvement in school and community volunteer activities, must accompany application.

Special Condition: The recipient is to continue her involvement in Guiding in whatever way possible, submitting a letter of progress to the Girl Guides of Canada – Prince George District's Bursary Committee at the end of the year. Two letters of reference (one from a Guider) outlining commitment to self-improvement and current involvement in Girl Guides of Canada within a Prince George District must accompany application. The recipient must agree to have her name and photograph publicized.
